

CHRISTIAN SCHOOL EVENT GUIDE

Incorporate Operation Christmas Child shoebox packing into a class or schoolwide project. This event can consist of a school-sponsored packing party and/or a collection of individually packed shoeboxes.

OVERVIEW

What is Operation Christmas Child?

<u>Operation Christmas Child</u> uses gift-filled shoeboxes to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Every shoebox gift is a resource for evangelism and discipleship, which leads to the multiplication of new believers and churches around the world.

You can be a part of what God is doing in these communities through Operation Christmas Child. Individuals, youth groups, student organizations, Christian schools, and homeschoolers all can get involved in this life-changing effort.

What are the benefits for student groups to participate in Operation Christmas Child?

- Partner with Operation Christmas Child to share the Gospel around the world.
- Use this project to engage students outside or new to your group as well as regular attenders.
- Integrate faith and learning through personal experiences and group activities.
- Create and facilitate leadership development opportunities.
- Increase awareness about the global need for the Gospel.
- · Foster partnerships within your community.

Promotional Suggestions and Resources

- Show Operation Christmas Child videos during general assemblies.
- Share spiritual impact stories your student media network and publications.

Spiritual Development

- **Bible Research:** Enlist students to identify Bible verses related to various aspects of the project, such as missions, evangelism, compassion, generosity, and stewardship. Incorporate these verses into your project promotion.
- **Prayer:** Encourage participants to pray for each step of the process: gathering empty boxes to fill, collecting items, packing shoeboxes, and preparing the finished boxes for drop off.

ACADEMIC LIFE SKILLS

- Leadership and Responsibility: Give students leadership responsibilities in the project.
- Research and Cooperation: Involve students in deciding on the event theme and in developing the shoebox goal.
- Community Relations: Ask local businesses for shoebox item donations.
- Presentation skills: Develop presentations to give in classes, at assemblies, and to school clubs and organizations.
- Organization: Task classes with collecting shoebox items based on age groups (2-4, 5-9, and 10-14).
- Public Speaking and Writing: Ask students to write and give promotional announcements about the project.
- Inventory: Task students with tallying the quantities of items donated or shoeboxes collected.
- Problem Solving: Host a debrief meeting to evaluate successes and document ways to improve the project next year.
- Technology: Use multi-media presentations, record keeping, and promotions.
- Supply Chain: Guide students to chart the project from acquisition of resources to delivery of goods.

PRE-EVENT

- Encourage group participation (Administration, Alumni, Athletics, Faculty/Staff, International Students, Student Government, etc.).
- Set up a meeting with all parties involved and form a plan for the events.
- Lead the team to prayerfully set a shoebox goal.
- Reserve a location(s) where the events will be hosted.
- Share your vision for the events. Show inspirational videos about the impact of a gift-filled shoebox.
- Establish a process to <u>collect shoebox items</u> and <u>raise money</u> for shipping and other project costs. Remember, your only limitation is how many shoeboxes and how many items you have to put in those shoeboxes. Plan accordingly.
- Collect standard-size shoeboxes or order Operation Christmas Child preprinted shoeboxes.
- Print or order labels to affix to each shoebox.
- Invite a local artist or worship band to play Christmas carols or arrange for music to play during the events.
- Locate your nearest shoebox <u>drop-off location</u> and determine transportation for collected shoeboxes.

WEEK OF THE EVENT

Monday and Tuesday: Set up a shoebox central station where students can get <u>free brochures</u> on <u>how to pack a shoebox</u>, receive shoeboxes to fill, and donate their filled shoeboxes. <u>Shoebox costumes</u> are available to order as a fun way to promote the events. You could even host a shoebox costume dance-off competition. If using preprinted shoeboxes, enlist volunteers to fold them, add a brochure, and distribute on campus.

Wednesday: Host a packing party for students, classes, and groups. Serve Christmas-themed snacks and play fun music.

Friday: Celebrate! Continue the Christmas theme with food and music. Share <u>inspirational videos</u> and pray for recipients. Host a shoebox send-off celebration where the group prays over the assembled shoeboxes.

POST-EVENT

Transport shoeboxes to a nearby <u>drop-off location</u>.
